The Rocky Mountain Region is home to many of the United States National Parks and Monuments,

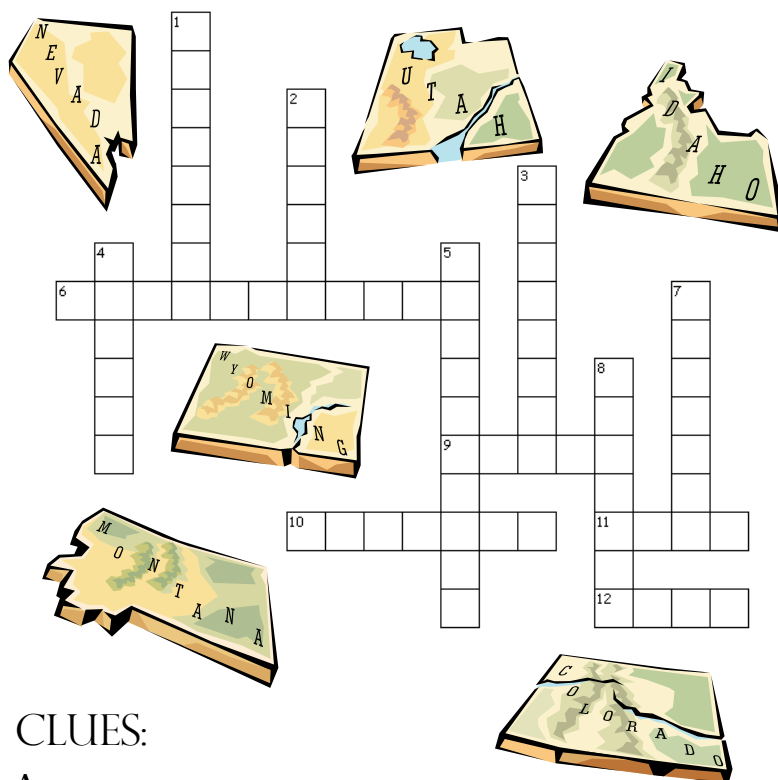
including Yellowstone National Park, the first national park in the world.
