Climbing Your DNA Genetic Genealogy

with Roberta Estes

Roberta Estes, one of the leading experts in the field, will present **Climbing your DNA: Genetic Genealogy**, a seminar on the use of DNA testing in genealogical research problem solving.

Roberta founded DNAeXplain (www.dnaexplain.com) in 2003, following a successful 25 year career as President of Information Access Strategies, Inc., a consulting firm that manages and implements leading edge technology projects in the government sector. She is a professional scientist and business owner (BS Computer Science, MBA, graduate work in Geographic Information Systems), and has been an obsessed genealogist since 1978.

Roberta's genealogy specialty is southern colonial records, focused primarily in Virginia, Tennessee and North Carolina. Minority records, which reflect her own mixed heritage, are of particular interest, specifically those relating to Native Americans, African Americans, and other indentured individuals. When the infant scientific field of DNA for genealogy emerged, Roberta was one of the early DNA surname administrators and pioneer adopters of DNA analysis for genealogy. She manages over 20 surname projects including the large regional Cumberland, the Lost Colony and the North Carolina Native Heritage projects, performing a significant amount of both genealogical and DNA research and analysis pertaining to surname projects and to individual clients' test results.

Ms. Estes will be the featured speaker at the fifth annual ISOGG (International Society for Genetic Genealogy) conference. She has previously lectured widely, authored a column for a technology magazine, written books in the technology arena and is in the process of writing a book about her experiences with DNA and Genealogy. The Genealogy Center is pleased to welcome her as the instructor for this timely course.
